- People down below deck are support folks (cooks, supplies, helpers) and even people who are along for the ride
- Our children are also on the boat
- Our sails are Powered by the wind of the Holy Spirit
- Visionaries on Crow's Nest showing us which way to go
- Jesus (cross) is our primary offering
- In surrounding waters & dry land are people in need of help, some who want to join,
- Who should be on the boat: We want more of everything more diversity, wide age range, more people in the "gap" between our two predominant generation might be our rich fishing ground!
- God is calling us to steer into deeper waters instead of still waters more great things outside the doors of this church, not just great things inside the doors of this church we're heading in the right direction to do just that

- Little children
- We want people of all diversity rainbow of colors, people of color, LGBTQ community
- Love, Justice, Mercy, Compassion, & Forgiveness are on our boat we want all people to receive these things on our boat
- Bible is on our boat as well

- Pastor Leigh Ann is driving the boat
- Waters are typical ocean waters, people swimming in the waters, shark (Satan) is in the water as well

- Paddles are going in lots of different directions which means we're often stuck
- Congregation is on the boat, paddling hard
- Pastor Leigh Ann is in the back steering, surrounded by committees, committee chairs, Pastors Frank & Beckie, music & children's ministries
- Outside the boat floating along sports, minorities, universal church, LGBTQ community, homeless, community at large, young adults
- Sun shines on us all
- Called to steer toward more focused outreach & more consistent in reach caregiving

- Sailboat, powered by the wind
- We have no sails, because our team isn't working well enough to hoist the sails and get the boat moving - we're kind of stuck

'Reconciling Minister at UMCV'

- UMCV welcomes all gender diversity: young, old, rich, poor, age, gender, ethnicity
- All faiths welcome here muslim, jewish, eastern
- Invite neighbors children to come to church with you. Then invite parents to see the programs the children are in!
- Invite your children friends to come to church. The more the Merrier!
- "Suffer the little children to come unto me" Bring children to observe the values, songs, gifts of love, kindness, acceptance to all especially to LGBTQ children
- Enfold all of God's children with God's love

Additional Ideas/Dreams & Visions to consider

- It remains vital for UMC vista to expand through <u>planned</u> ministries for our community
- To expand our welcoming area upstairs for fellowship
- To expand our nursery facilities near worship and on the main floor, making it easier for parents to be close to their children
- I think a great idea would be to have the <u>beautiful big window in the sanctuary lit up</u> <u>like a Christmasy tree every night!</u> It could become a beacon and very welcoming as so many cars go by and seen from window across the street. Instead of church being dark at night it would look warm and bright

- Better communication for full congregation about those who are suddenly ill, in accidents, or experiencing- grief (Hearing them in pastor prayers Sunday not enough; hearing about it informally during fellowship time is not enough)

How Do We Get More Members and More Funds?

- Moving in that direction together

- Our shared energy will attract new persons
- People will be able to join and serve along with the church
- Funds & numerical growth follow spiritual growth, and begins with current members & mature Christians
- Growth in generosity and community leads to increased giving
- The people who will join us will share that energy, abundance
- Lead with your own spiritual growth
- Business mindset is not what we lead with; business mindset and focusing on our shared purpose helps us row effectively, powerfully, in the same direction
- Christ Jesus leads us

- This will be a factor during the action planning and implementation
- These groups will be consulted to input and participation

What Would Happen if We Became Reconciling?

- The church would grow if it is a part of what God is calling us to do and we have a strategic plan and purpose for reaching out as an inclusive community
- Make sure you are in conversation with Church Council land Gap Team to make sure we are all rowing in the same direction and are coordinated
- Talk to larger church before you start implementing and a new idea
- We don't want to do too many good things moving us simultaneously in different directions

- Will we review the current programs/events, asking these questions of each one?

What committee is in charge?

Are they effective?

Are they purposeful in the church?

Examples:

1) Trunk or Treat- This is organized by education but it is not educational, it is community outreach

2) Family game night- who attends this? What is its expectation/purpose?

3) All church camp- why hasn't it worked the last few years?

Timing? Itinerary?Location? Does it still serve purpose?

- Will we examine current offerings? Examples might be:
 - Does Sunday School curriculum fulfill desires?
 - Lessons, music
 - Music
 - Is music choice what is desired by existing congregation and incoming visitors
 - Use of current space
 - ex: Does narthex layout promote easy understanding of who UMC Vista is and what we have to offer?
