

### **Pastor's Ponderings**

We are mid-way through the year and what have we accomplished? We've given grant funding to 22 community organizations, we've worked on our ministry action plan (MAP), we've fed people, taught children, shepherded three confirmands, offered seven different discipleship classes or support groups, shared in 43 worship services, offered three musical concert events... All since January 1, 2018. That's a lot... and there is much more! The list could go on and on describing how this church family is offering Christ's love to one another, our neighbors and our world every day!!

Pastor Frank and I will be attending Annual Conference this June at the University of the Redlands. This may be the last year we go to Redlands for this event. There is a plan to move the California Pacific Annual Conference to San Diego in 2019! (I'm really excited and think this is a great idea!) Our Bishop, Rev. Grant Hagiya, is working with a conference leadership group to reduce our conference budget and expand the conference support of local churches. He has also been a part of the conversation our denomination is having about how to move forward as people who have regionally divided beliefs about human sexuality. The conversation will continue during a Special General Conference in 2019 as we seek to be people who are faithful to Jesus Christ and transform the world in love. In addition, there were some recent changes to our denomination's constitution and at least one amendment change will likely bounce-back to all the Annual Conferences for discussion and maybe a new vote.

As I look into the rest of the year, I'm so excited to continue working on ministry with you! We will hold a special All Church Charge Conference on June 27th at 7 p.m. to review and vote on the Ministry Action Plan as an entire congregation. Everyone is welcome to come! The District Superintendent, Rev. John Farley, will join us for this special time of honoring our past by looking into our future, as we name and affirm the work that God has called us to! I don't know yet how you want to reorganize and use the building and land that we occupy. I don't yet know how the budget will shape up or how the numbers will work out. But I do know you are passionate and driven to care for one another and this community and the world! I KNOW God is calling you forward and despite the suspicion some have for Christianity and Church, we are reaching new people every week.

I continue to be honored to be the senior pastor in charge at UMC Vista and have great joy about the ministry we are doing! Thank you for your faithful work and kindness as we grow together!

### Finance/Stewardship Update

As we head into the summer months we want to celebrate and thank you for your generous support to the many important ministries and outreach programs of our church. Your support of our general fund budget is essential to keep our church and ministry programs up and running. To date we are meeting our essential ministry budget items, although total estimated pledges and givers of record support leaves us about \$18,000 short of our 2018 budget needs. You are a giving and caring congregation. As of the second week of Sunday in May you have given in excess of \$125,000 to supporting our ministry needs. We are planning two events during the summer and fall to help us close the budget gap.

Regular giving is easy and helps us do more intentional ministry. You may put cash or a check in the envelope located in the pews and place it in the collection plate in the worship service. Our X-tra Mile Ministry Giving for June will be the Women's Resource Center (WRC) which is dedicated to providing the highest quality support services, counseling, shelter and education to North San Diego County women, children and men involved in or threatened by domestic violence or sexual assault. WRC assists its clients in healing so that they can do the following.

BUILD: their dignity, self esteem and confidence.

LEARN: that what has happened is not their fault.

KNOW: that they and their children have a safe haven.

FEEL RELIEF: from the fear of physical, verbal and emotional abuse.

FIND OUT: that someone understands their problems and that there are solutions.

HOPE: by learning that they can make different, better choices in the future.

There are a variety of needs on their wish list which will be available for you in the Narthex throughout June. Thank you for your continued caring and support for the people of North County.

### **Congregational Care Committee**

The mission of our UMC Congregational Care Committee is to bring care, contact, love and support to those who are homebound, recovering from illness, or in need of other such pastoral care. The Committee meets on the second Thursday of each month to develop a visitation plan in order to serve all those before us. The committee receives names brought forward from Pastor Leigh Ann, Pastor Frank, the church office, referrals, prayer requests and family members. We thank each of you for being the eyes and ears of our church family by keeping us updated on the needs of our congregation.

As a committee, we develop a communication plan to ensure we maintain a close connection with each person. Pastor Leigh Ann, Pastor Frank and Karen Felien lead our visitation discussions as we work to provide consistency in our spiritual care. A lead contact person is designated to make certain we serve each member on our list. In addition, we call, send cards, offer communion and grief counseling. Stephen Ministers are also available upon request by contacting Mike Walker.

- 7: Study and Learn. Read scriptures. Read other faith pilgrims. Read the classic by Brother Lawrence's The Practice of the Presence of God. Go to a discipleship class.
- 6: Share your time, talent and treasure. Give your time and let the world benefit from your skills, knowledge and wisdom. Tithe 10% of all the money that comes to you to those doing good work in faith. Your life will be changed by Giving.
- 5: Treat your Body Right. You only get one body. Honor it. Care for it. Take a Sabbath rest. Eat the best quality food you can. Work up a little sweat.
- 4: Cultivate Compassion. Compassion means 'feel with.' From the homeless man on the street, to the college student, or your most frustrating family member, consider what it would be like to 'walk in their shoes.'
- 3: KEEP A SABBATH. It doesn't have to be Sunday, but pick a day or hour to turn off to the world's demands and turn in to God's Re-Creating recreation creation.
- 2: Get JOY. Not just happiness but deep joy. Joy is contagious and spreads. Joy can be found, discovered, cultivated and shared. Being faithful doesn't mean you frown all the time. Laugh often and pass it along!
- 1: Accept Yourself. You can only stretch so far. You can only live in the moment right now. You are beautiful in God's heart, so why shouldn't you give yourself a break? Even if you are working on getting healthy or paying off your bills or restoring a relationship with someone, don't spend your life saying... 'when this or that happens I'll be ok, happy, and satisfied.'
