Retirement of Scoutmaster Jim Eighmey

Troop 709's Scoutmaster, Jim Eighmey, recently announced his retirement from that role effective December 31, 2018.

Jim Eighmey's Scouting adventure began when he joined the Cub Scouts, then bridged into Boy Scouts and finally into Explorers. Jim is an Eagle Scout and Vigil Honors member of the Order of the Arrow.

In 2013, when Jim took over as Troop 709's fifth Scoutmaster in its 33-year history, it was during a difficult time. He was still relatively new to the unit, but took on the challenging role of repairing a Troop suffering from neglect and from a recent betrayal of trust. Jim has not only rebuilt the unit to a consistently excellent unit, but worked tirelessly to improve the relationship with the unit committee, our church, and its sister unit, Venturing Crew 709. Jim provided opportunities for a youth-led Scouting unit and enhanced the Troop's high adventure program into a truly exceptional youth experience. Jim supplemented this with work by volunteering leadership with the Scottish Highland Games, Mountain Man Rendezvous, and the District Camporee. Also, under Jim's leadership, the Troop has embarked on various successful fundraising campaigns, including the annual golf tournament, which allows the Troop to help directly fund the Troop's summer camp and high adventure programs. Under Jim's leadership, 33 boys have attained the rank of Eagle Scout!

Jim has been honored by the Boy Scouts of America with various awards for his work as a volunteer leader. Jim is a gifted leader whose mentorship has vastly improved our Troop and made it one of the best Boy Scout Troops in the San Diego-Imperial Council.

Jim recently announced his retirement. Jim's successor, Mark McKinnon, will take over for him in January 2019. Mark has big shoes to fill, though! Jim will stay on as an Assistant Scoutmaster continuing to ensure a smooth leadership transition and providing guidance to the new Scoutmaster. Jim will be greatly missed in his Scoutmaster role, though, and we wish him the very best.
