Pastor's Ponderings

"How is it with your soul?"

Are you ready to try something new? I'm not sure if I am or not. The last year has left me tired and unsettled. The months ahead could be challenging. I have a lot of hope for our ministry and all that we do together, but the weariness of our days is real. I've heard many of you say you share similar concerns.

The father of the Methodist Church is John Wesley. Wesley lived his faith with consistency and a method. We are called "Methodist" because of Wesley's adherence to order and structure. If you know the orderliness of a military life, you understand what I'm talking about. John Wesley was a disciplined faith leader whose faith journey still inspires our life of faithfulness.

John Wesley would open up all small group meetings with the question "How is it with your soul?" It is a deeper question than, "How are you?" It is easy to give an answer to the "how are you?" question without really saying anything. It is easy to say, "I'm fine," or "Same ole, same ole." Maybe we prefer to have an easy out and not give any thought to how our soul is doing, but maybe now is the exact time we need to get busy with one of John Wesley's best practices.

"How is it with your soul?" When I reflect on my soul, I start with the first words that pop to mind. Right now my words are "weary" and "concerned." What are yours? Sometimes I call a friend to do some reflection about the state of my spirit. Sometimes I journal or sit at the ocean or take a walk. Always I listen for God and try to keep focus. A scripture teaches us to listen for God and God will bring a message to our heart.

I remember when I was going through my divorce, it was harder to hear God because I felt betrayed and hurt. It was a wedge between me and God that took some time to heal. When I served as a chaplain in the hospital, I noticed that health concerns often created a wedge between people and God. If you aren't feeling or hearing God, it doesn't mean that God has left you. Sometimes our spirit or soul gets confused, just like a compass that isn't working right.

The good news is that God's a soul healer. When you start to listen to your soul speak, you have taken a step of faith. Give it a little room and trust that God's in the mix of your life. If you feel brave, keep going! What are the things or people that bring you joy and satisfaction? What are things that drain the life out of you? If you could, what things would you reject from your life forever? If you dare to answer, where do you most feel alive and like your best self? Being honest with yourself takes a lot of courage. It also takes faith.

God isn't as stuffy as we imagine. God is more than our routine and ritual. It's easy to get stuck and get by and ignore how it is with your soul. Five minutes or a few days or some time with friends might be the prescription God is giving you to tend to your soul. Laugh and cry. Pray and wonder. Be in awe or be overwhelmed or be silly or be creative. Sing. God created us to have abundant life not to just to be fine or okay. "How is it with your soul?"
