## **Pastor's Ponderings**

What ARE you waiting for? What are YOU waiting for? WHAT are you waiting for?

I love written words significantly more than spoken words. Written words allow themselves to be considered slowly and with intention. Written words can be spoken aloud if needed but do not have to be. Written words are an invitation to consider but spoken words can sometimes just be noise in an already noisy world. Thanks for reading this pastoral reflection about waiting and Advent and the Word.

If you feel like it, go back and read the top line again. Read the question about you and waiting, and then come back HERE. How do you answer that question? Do you have the patience to wait or is it too much to ask? As we look into December and the season before Christmas, God is calling us to the spiritual practice of waiting. Advent is the waiting time for Jesus to come into the world. (On Christmas, we will proclaim the Light has arrived, but right now, we wait.)

Where is Jesus and why hasn't God straightened out all that is wrong with the world yet? The world seems too dark and mean and difficult. I find the world rather hard-hearted these days. It can be rather discouraging. The truth is that Jesus comes again and again to our heart and demands that we use our life to straighten things out. Jesus floods us with love and compassion to soften our heart. Jesus said, "Go, love your neighbor." Jesus said, "Feed the hungry, clothe the naked, care for the broken and hurting." Jesus gave us instructions and in small and not so small ways, we do our service. The service we do of caring for others is like Jesus pouring some Downey fabric softener on us as we spin in a drier.

The world keeps on spinning with us hanging on for life. Do you get tired of waiting for the world to change? Do you ever feel like your contribution and service doesn't mean enough? Do you ever wonder why God trusted you and me and that strange person who annoys you so much? I do. I want people I love to be cared for and my neighbors to quit yelling and the people in Africa to have enough food and water. I have a long list of things that I believe would make the world better. My list gets longer every day and sometimes it is tough to hold on to hope. Sometimes it's difficult to trust I'm making a difference but then I remember you. I remember YOU are out there doing stuff too. And then I remember all the churches and all the people who are doing a little to change things.

Waiting is not glamorous. Waiting is a pause between here and there. Waiting DEMANDS faith. Waiting is a muscle that God challenges us to use. Wait in the darkness with HOPE. The Light is coming to the World. Wait in the darkness and have peace in your heart. The Prince, our brother, is coming to set us right. Wait in the darkness and let joy leap within you, even when you aren't sure that everything will turn out okay. Wait in the darkness and listen for God to say, "I love you dearly." God whispers and so you will need to really listen.

Last year our waiting was lonely. That was 365 days ago and we've changed since then. I pray you let the sadness of last year fall away from your heart in time for Christmas. When we step into faith, God changes our heart to the Good. The twinkle lights will lead you and hint for the brighter days to come. This year the spoken Word of God is coming and with that Holy Word, a fresh light that brings us a new path.

May you be blessed in the Waiting. May you be encouraged by the lights and music and spirit of hope. May you find renewal and comfort through the waiting.

## Did you Know....?

The United Methodist Church of Vista has been serving homeless and families in need since the late 1990's? It started at Lado de Loma with a lady by the name of Janet Sucro who felt compelled to help those in need. Our own Rev. Don Diegelman was part of the group that worked along with many other caring UMC Vistans. "and Two Fishes" was incorporated in 1999.

When we moved to our temporary quarters at Breeze Hill Elementary, crew and food moved to, and was served out of All Saints Episcopal on Eucalyptus and Civic Center Drive. Once we moved to our new location here at Melrose Drive, serving these folks in need started up again in 2014.

The Thursday Night Soup Kitchen was incorporated in 1999 and applied for their own 501(c)(3) with its own Board of Directors. The name was "and Two Fishes" and they continued to serve warm meals and a take-away lunch. In 2020, it was decided that "and Two Fishes" would once again come under the umbrella of UMC Vista and "and Two Fishes" By-Laws were changed to meet requirements of UMC Vista so they could come under the church's insurance.

Even through the pandemic, although there were safety changes, folks were still able to receive two meals per visit. Through all this time caring UMC Vistans have been important to this ministry outreach. And in 2018, Congregational Care added another element to the picture through "Helping Hands" which was developed to meet health and hygiene, clothing, and even some animal needs of our clients.

This wonderful and important ministry, over the years, has met the needs of many folks in Vista both on a temporary and long-term basis. We can thank Congregational Care and the community folk that continue to help us meet the needs of THIS community we call home, Vista, California.
