## **Pastor's Ponderings**

We, human beings, are accustomed to resting in the darkness and seldom greet a new day. We are accustomed to closing our eyes and laying down and letting days and nights flow automatically without ever thinking that we don't do anything to make it happen. It is comforting that the universe runs without our intervention. Perhaps remembering that might be our first gratitude in the new year.

As we begin a new year, I am thinking about clocks and how we experience time. I remember my first alarm clock that I had to wind up every night and set to wake me up in the morning. I was in early grade school and it was one of those alarms that clangggged and rangggg and startled me awake every morning. Our relationship with time isn't always an easy one when our clocks become our keepers.

The wisdom author of Ecclesiastes says, "for everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." The scriptures offer a subtle warning about time in the subtext. We have no control over time. Our days cannot be lengthened by our bartering or productivity. Just as the day and night return again and again without our participation, the time of our life passes too.

As the new year begins, it begins in the darkness. I appreciate the easy way days come and go and the noisy clocks of old are gone. When we wake up on January 1st, we assume that we will have 12 months or 365 days (if you prefer) ahead of us. I won't be setting a resolution this year, but I will be considering how to add more joy to the year. The last two years have disturbed the regular pace of living and made joy in life more precious than ever.

Paul writes to the Philippians, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice." Our faith encourages us to joy and rejoicing. Joy is important and valuable and the beloved children of God are worthy of Joy!

Rather than being sad that our days are fleeting, a new year is a time to celebrate that a new time has begun. Rather than being sad for what is behind us, there is infinite joy in what is ahead of us. God's heaven on earth is a play-box of delight and compassion and kindness and love. We have no control over days and nights, but we do have a say over whether we will love life and celebrate each moment.

Looking into 2022, I celebrate YOU! I celebrate the faithfulness of this congregation coming out of a very difficult time and building a new space for ministry and mission and fellowship and friends and fun! I celebrate the opportunities that we haven't even thought of yet! When so many others are lamenting in hopelessness and criticism, we are looking forward in truth and confidence of the Lord.

## Reconciling Moment from the Vatican

On Dec. 12, 2021 an official at the Vatican's Synod office issued an apology to New Ways Ministry (a Catholic organization building bridges between the LGBTQ community and the Catholic Church since 1977) and LGBTQ Catholics after removing a video relating to church matters. The link has since been restored.

Theirry Bonaventura, Communication Manager of the General Secretariat for the Synod of Bishops, issued the apology on Sunday. New Ways Ministry organization "warmly" accepted the apology recognizing that apologies are never easy to make. New Ways Ministry had not requested one, making this gesture all the more authentic. Vatican officials rarely apologize, and they almost certainly have never apologized to LGBTQ people or an LGBTQ Catholic ministry. This action signals that Vatican officials are becoming aware of how their decisions impact LGBTQ lives...an example of amazing grace which can be brought to life when one practices honesty and humility, and is concerned about how one's actions may harm other people. This unprecedented apology from a Vatican office amplifies the welcome that Pope Francis has extended to LGBTQ people. God indeed works in mysterious ways, turning what could have been great harm into an instrument of greater connection.
