As we head into the last four months of the church year many things have changed. Important and exciting things continue to be happening in the life of our church. We are happy to be able to return to in-person worship services. We thank you for your continued generous support of the financial requirements of our Church budget. The good news is that currently our financial obligations are being met and ministry plans are ongoing. The other side of the coin is that we are behind for our total giving to fully fund the 2022 budget. Additional giving opportunities to close this shortfall are under way with the Thanksgiving and Christmas offerings.

Plans are underway for the October stewardship campaign to raise the funds necessary to meet our 2023 budget obligations. You will hear more about these plans in the coming weeks. Your support of our general fund budget is essential to keep your Church and ministry programs up and running. You are a caring and giving congregation. If you are behind in your giving or wish to make additional gifts to help your church reduce our budget shortfall for 2022, please prayerfully consider doing so.

News from our Community Partners....

El Porvenir

In July, my family and I had the pleasure of visiting El Porvenir staff and projects in 5 of the 6 regions where we work. Of course it was a valuable experience for me to meet coworkers in person and get a more in-depth understanding of our work in the communities. It was also an invaluable experience for my teenage daughters to see the ways the communities work together to address some of the challenges of living in rural Nicaragua.

For example, in the village of La Mesa, Camoapa, some beneficiaries of a drilled well project gathered to share their experience. It was so meaningful to hear how this older woman still didn't quite believe she finally had access to water close to her home. The woman behind her had broken her leg in the mud while carrying back a full bucket of water, and became the instigator in bringing the community together, requesting the project and raising the community contribution toward it. And the young woman was full of gratitude, sharing how she sent a video of when the driller hit water to community members who were away, shouting, "There's water!" That, of course, is exactly the mission of El Porvenir: Partner with rural Nicaraguans to develop and implement lasting projects and educational programs that increase access to clean water.

One thing that impressed me across all of our visits was the real sense of ownership in the projects among the community members. More than once, the phrase "mano a mano" (hand in hand) was used when they described working with El Porvenir. And the ownership is financial as well; one community with a 10-year old water system in El Sauce told us their bank balance is over \$5,000 (US) to cover any needed maintenance or replacement costs.

One last memorable example is when a community member in Terrabona was demonstrating how to conduct a water test, and my daughter leaned over and whispered, "Wait, does she work with El Porvenir too?" Nope! She was just so well trained by our actual employee that it seemed like it!

It was very rewarding to see the lasting impact of projects funded years ago, and to see the ongoing work that our dedicated staff (and trained community volunteers!) are able to accomplish "mano a mano" with the communities.

Thank you for your support of this important work!
