Pastor's Ponderings

The Essentials

What is YOUR essential? What are the essentials of the church? What grounds us individually and together?

The United Methodist Church is the result of many divisions and mergers among Christians over many years. We have in our roots ancestors from England, with both highly ritualized faith and faith that takes a street-level view of the world. We place a high value on education, and thoughtful study. On our best days we bring faith that clings to the lively Holy Spirit and faith that cares for our neighbors.

Our Book of Discipline contains all our history, beliefs and values, social principles and how we organize every committee of the local congregation. The word "discipline" conveys our orderly and organized method of faith and living faithfully. The earliest students and disciples of John Wesley were mocked as they were called "Methodist." It was meant unkindly, but the attention to process and focus has served us over time.

That same methodical process has held us in a long, and often heartbreaking, conversation about homosexuality and human intimacy. For decades we've considered the biblical and social nature of sexuality, reflecting on our experience and tradition. We've talk to each other, about each other and sometimes even listened to one another. It appears that the church is no longer willing to live in conversation but is nearing a dramatic restructuring. You will hear that some churches are "disaffiliating" from the United Methodist Church. You may hear about a new group called the Global Methodist Church. There is a lot of misinformation and even intentional deception surrounding this pivotal moment.

The essential I circle back to is from John Wesley's sermon 39 on the spirit of faith. He preaches, "though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may. Herein all the children of God may unite, notwithstanding these smaller differences. Hold you fast that which you believe is most acceptable to God, and I will do the same."

The United Methodist Church continues to be most aligned with my faith and my understanding of faith as our mandate for caring for one another and the world. Even though I do not agree with every position of our church, our structure, tradition and process, I understand we are a people who trust in the ever creating work of God through the Holy Spirit and that humility leads us forward. I long for the day that our denomination fully includes all persons, celebrating love, and commitment. Where one person is lost, all the community loses.

May we find together the deepest truth of God's gracious love for all. Amen.

News from our Community Partners....

Grace Children's Hospital (GCH) (Haiti)

A recent letter from the director or ICC that oversees Grace Children's Hospital tells us the following. While they continue to be very grateful for the 2022 grant from UMC Vista, she writes: "GCH has been closed these past weeks due to increasing kidnapping, crime and civil unrest in the area. Protests, demonstrations, and roadblocks are frequent, and can turn violent. On top of that there is a new outbreak of cholera in Port-au-Prince."

In a recent news article, the UN has described Haiti and Port-au-Prince in particular as a humanitarian catastrophe with gang violence across the country and over 25,000 driven from their homes, most of them women and children.

In the 55 years since Grace Children's Hospital has been in existence, there has been only one other time when the hospital closed and that was for a short period. So the situation is pretty dire. Your prayers are urgently needed.

Boys & Girls Club of Vista

"Smark Moves" Program Update

SMART Moves is a nationally recognized Boys & Girls Club program that focuses conflict resolution while building self-esteem and resiliency. The funding received truly helped propel character development among our club members and increase social-emotional skills. We achieved our participant goals of 60 Club members; 61% of Club members reported that the Club was optimally safe and positive; 81% of participants surveyed reported that they had not been involved in any fighting the past year which is 4% higher than the national average; 92% of participants expected to graduate high school; and 100% of teen Club members surveyed abstained from drinking, smoking and sexual activity. No Club members were in trouble with the law.

Raul Castillo and Naomi Wade are dedicated to Smart Moves programs by grade level at the Boys & Girls Club of Vista and Nora Pozos at our Raintreet Learning Center Site. We also collaborated with another nonprofit, the Changing Tides Foundation, to provide SMART Moves classes for middle-school aged girls along with weekly surfing lessons.

We appreciate your incredible generosity in helping us inspire more great futures for our Club members.

Being a Reconciling Congregation

Reconciling Ministries is a group within our church committed to encouraging full inclusion of our LGBTQ folks in all aspects of church life. A Reconciling Church is one in which the church as a whole is committed to being fully inclusive of everyone, including our LGBTQ folks. Currently the United Methodist Church's *Book of Discipline* specifically bars these people from becoming ordained ministers or having a same-sex marriage. While becoming a member of the Reconciling Ministries Network would not change the *Book of Discipline* in any way, it would allow us to join the growing group of churches taking a stand in changing the wording.

You may have noticed members of our church handing out FAQ sheets about becoming a fully reconciling church. Reconciling Ministries supports justice for all groups, including people of color and women. It is the goal of the Reconciling Ministries group to encourage our church to become fully reconciling in all ways. This can be done by a vote at our upcoming Charge Conference on November 20. Please plan to attend this important meeting.
