Pastor's Ponderings

It is the most important day of the Christian life: Easter. Every year brings a little different experience of Easter, depending on where we are in life and what is happening in the world. As you think of meeting Jesus on the morning of the Resurrection, what will you bring with you this year? How will Easter touch your heart in 2024?

This year I'm thinking about how Jesus met everyone where they were, even on the way to the Cross. He listened to Pilate, Judas, Peter, Mary and Martha and all the others, right where they were. To the religious leader, political leader, confused disciple, grieving sister, angry friend, Jesus met them in their concerns and listened. To the hungry, Jesus talked about hunger. To the sick or suffering, Jesus concerned himself with illness and pain. To the excluded or marginalized, Jesus spoke about the left-out and left-behind. Even on the Cross, Jesus listened to the two people who were hanging near him, and to those on the ground.

Jesus demonstrated what some call soft leadership on the way to the Cross. Soft-leadership skills are skills that connect us with other people. Soft-leadership is empathy, compassion, honesty, integrity, deep listening, teamwork, conflict resolution, creativity and adaptability. Jesus' commitment to love even those cast out of society is soft-leadership. Hard-leadership skills are often described as teachable skills you learn for a task or job. The ability to fill out forms, or follow processes and procedures are hard-leadership skills.

So many churches are declining because they focus on tasks and to-do lists. They get caught up in the process of being church and forget that church is a place called to exemplify welcome and belonging. Yes, there are forms and committee work we do to stay connected with each other and our larger community, but the primary work of a church is caring for people. If a church does nothing but deep and active listening with the goal of understanding, we will change the world. The kingdom of God is realized when people see and hear one another.

Easter is the moment when God listens and feels the deepest pain of the human world. Easter is the moment when God meets humanity where we are and turns everything around. Pain and hate will not define what it is to be human. Love and the journey to transformation and redemption is our path. God didn't give Jesus a to-do list for earthly life. God gave Jesus a heart and compassion that is so often under appreciated but is the very thing at the heart of our Gospel message this Easter. Amen.

Finance Focus

The Finance/Stewardship Committee submitted the Church 2024 budget to Church Council on Feb. 10. The budget was reviewed, discussed and approved by Church Council. The 2024 budget submitted was \$624,185.60. Total income expected for 2024 is \$453,600.00, which leaves the Church with a deficit of \$170,585.60. The Finance/Stewardship committee takes very seriously the operating budget for the church. We have several fundraising events planned for 2024 and Tom Humphrey will continue his efforts on restaurant fundraising. We will continue to closely monitor the budget and plan to give Church Council an update in June. We appreciate the congregation's continued giving to enable the Church to continue their outreach activities locally and beyond. Every dollar donated is greatly appreciated. Our Pennies For Heaven campaign will continue for 2024 and all funds received go directly to the operating expenses of the Church. Total Pennies For Heaven donations through February 25 are \$210. Blessings and prayers to you all.
