Pastor's Ponderings

As people with hope-infused faith, we are called to embrace change with a spirit of openness and courage. Yet, even with our steadfast belief in the transformative power of love and grace, transitions can often stir feelings of uncertainty and doubt within us. Whether it's a change in leadership, a shift in personal circumstances, or a larger upheaval in society, navigating transitions requires courage, resilience, and above all, faith.

In the face of uncertainty, we are reminded of the words of the Apostle Paul: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1). Our faith is not merely a passive acceptance of the status quo but an active trust in the promises of God, even when those promises seem distant or obscured by the clouds of change.

Journeying through transition, it is crucial that we lean on the pillars of our faith community for support and guidance. Our church community is a source of strength, compassion, and solidarity, offering a safe space where we can share our joys, fears, and uncertainties. Together, we remind each other of the enduring presence of God's love, which sustains us through every trial and tribulation.

Moreover, as Protestant Christians, we are called to view transitions not as disruptions to be feared but as opportunities for growth, renewal, and transformation. Just as the caterpillar undergoes a metamorphosis in the cocoon before emerging as a beautiful butterfly, so too can we emerge from times of transition with a renewed sense of purpose, clarity, and vision. Our Easter life testifies to transitions as times of dynamic growth.

In the words of the theologian, Howard Thurman, "Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive, and go do it. Because what the world needs is people who have come alive." If we can approach this time of transition with a sense of curiosity and wonder, trusting God's ever-present grace guiding us, we discover bold possibilities.

Looking into the Summer, there is a lot happening. I have already begun packing and changing my home residence, as well as finishing the packing of my office that began with our building process. It seems to me we've been headed toward this season of change for years and have finally made it through the long desert. What has sustained me, and I hope you in this time, are encouraging friends and faith values of inclusivity, justice and love that abides. We are a resilient community always held in the loving embrace of our Creator.

Methodist Federation for Social Action (MFSA)

What or who is MFSA? It is an intersectional social justice nonprofit that mobilizes Justice-Seeking People of Faith to take action on issues of peace, poverty and people's rights within the church, the nation, and the world. It is a network of chapters, communities, churches, and individuals that believe our Christian faith calls us to work toward a more justice-filled church, nation, and world.

Originally known as the Methodist Federation for Social Service, the Methodist Federation for Social Action (MFSA) was founded in 1907 by several Methodist Episcopal clergy (including Frank Mason North, author of "Where Cross the Crowded Ways of Life") to direct church attention to the enormous human suffering among the working class. Immediately the Federation became Methodism's unofficial rallying point for the Social Gospel and achieved the adoption of the first denominational social creed in 1908.

With over 100 years of service, MFSA has quite a storied history and more can be found at "mfsaweb. org". Ahead of this year's General Conference MFSA has made various proposals to bring our Book of Discipline into this century including around the issues of Climate Justice, Economic Justice, Gender Justice, LGBTQ+ Justice, Peace Building, Racial Justice and Reproductive Justice.

Justice in all things has been a part of the DNA of Methodism from its very inception. Some of the above information is taken from "mfsaweb.org."
